



Accountability Codes

Accountability codes provide users with the correct role to tag students who should not test or who were tested but should not appear in reporting. Accountability codes are commonly referred to as Void codes or Not Tested Codes in Maryland. Accountability codes should be applied to a student's test if it will not be sent to scoring. A user can also pull data in Session Explorer on which students have had accountability codes applied.

The following codes will not allow a new session (will not allow students to retest):


- EL First Year in U.S. (02)
- Incomplete Assessment (06)
- Off Grade (06)
- Fire Alarm (07)
- Disturbance (08)
- Absent (11)
- Home Hospital or Incarcerated (14)
- Other (20)

The following codes allow a new session (allow students to retest). Once these are applied, they <u>cannot</u> be removed by any role:

- Medical Emergency (01)
- Incorrect Accommodation/Accessibility Feature Applied (03)
- Cheating/Using Unauthorized Electronic Device (04)
- Test Security (05)
- Transferred or Withdrew (12)
- Suspended or Expelled (13)
- Refused to Participate (15)
- Changed to Certificate Bound (17)

Applying an Accountability Code

Once an Accountability Code has been applied it cannot be removed. If the test has been voided and a new test assigned this cannot be reversed.



- Select the correct code from the pop-up menu
- Click Apply

Void Codes will create a new session. The student will appear in the "Unassigned" bucket and will need to be placed into a proctor group or be provided with the test code of the proctor group they will be testing in.

Not Tested Codes can be changed to a Void Code to allow for a retest.
